Barbara Barrett has been designated as a permanent authorized party on the Children's Foundation LPL Investment accounts, and as such has provided the following report for account year 2022 during our annual meeting.

The investment account balance is reflective of the market has seen during this past year with a significant unrealized loss. Ending balance for February 2023 is \$184,755.96 which is a market increase of approximately \$5,000. Barb spoke to Randy Porter, our account advisor, and he recommended no changes at this time and felt the account was invested and rebalanced to reflect the best of the market opportunities.

Children in foster care continue to be served by our club volunteers. 700 children are in local foster care with 211 having a CASA Advocate and 489 children are waiting for a CASA. On average, children will spend 18-24 months in the local foster care system.

In the past decade, Yellowstone County has experienced a significant increase of children removed from their homes and placed into foster care. Nation-wide, the state of Montana has one of the highest populations of children in foster care per capita with Yellowstone County accounting for approximately 25% of all statewide removals each year.
